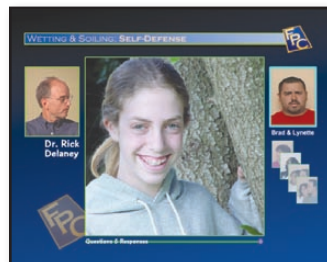

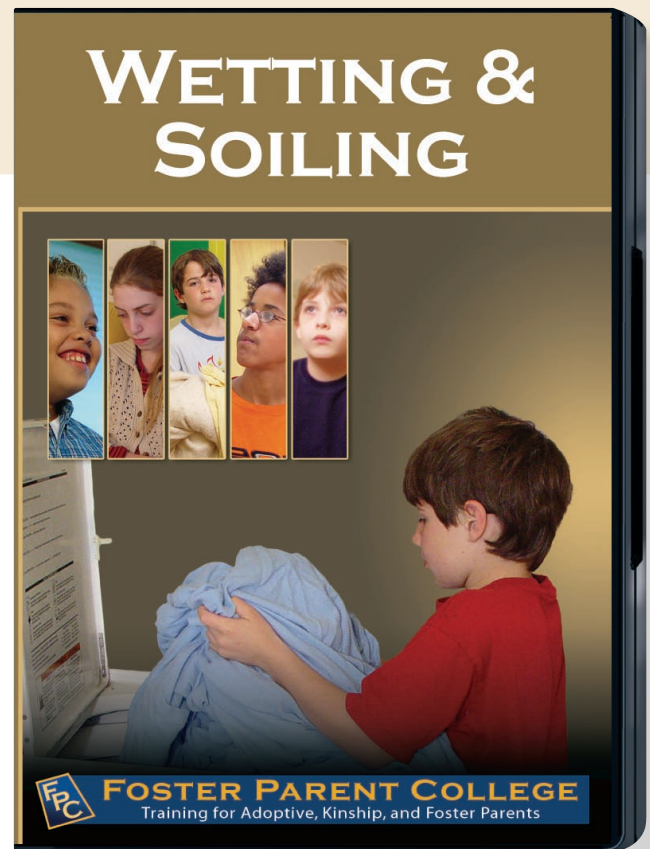


This program looks at five different children and their families to address wetting and soiling behaviors.
