

Foster Parent College: Working With Schools

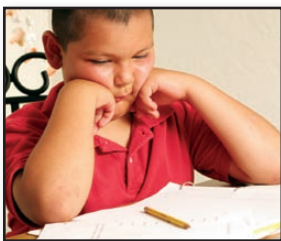

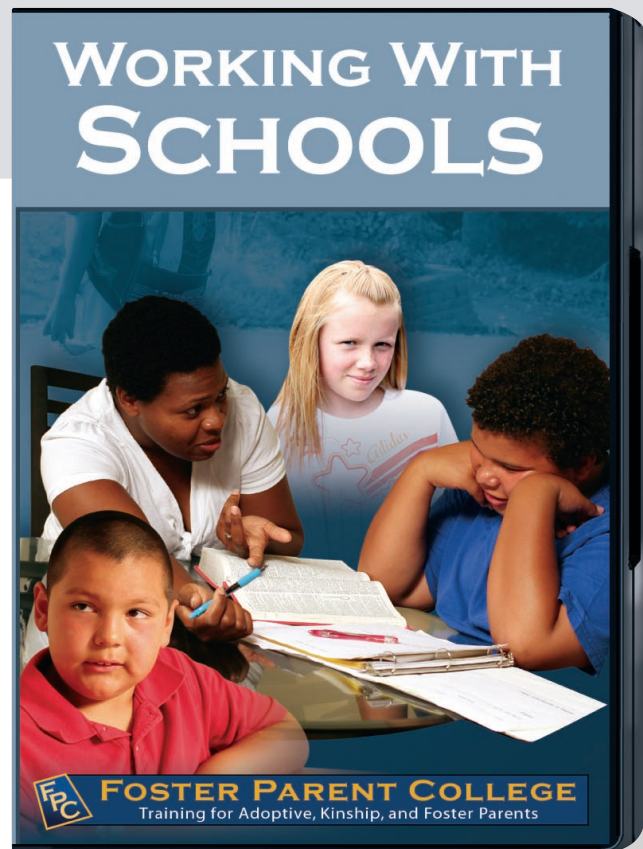
